Recruiting cos see a surge in demand from cos in food, hygiene, tech and delivery biz

New Delhi: With lockdown curbs easing and migrant labour in short supply, companies across sectors, from hazmat suits maker Wildcraft to e-commerce players Flipkart, Amazon and Licious, are back in the job market, staffing companies said.

Makers of laptops and tablets as well as IT and IT-enabled services sectors are looking for fresh talent as work-from-home and schooling-from-home are expected to continue for another three-four months at least, pushing demand for these products and services, they said. Also on demand are workforce for hygiene and safety-related gear and products makers, delivery staff for e-commerce firms, and pushcart vendors for ice-cream makers. "Festive demand, too, is expected to pick up by August and with more factories starting to open up in key markets like Delhi, Mumbai and Chennai... The demand-supply of labour workforce will have to be addressed," said Lohit Bhatia, president of staffing industry body Indian Staffing Federation (ISF).

Wildcraft, which is making reusable PPE overalls, hazmat suits and masks for the Ministry of Textiles & Commercial Applications, has hired more than 30,000 people in the past two months and is looking to hire another 70,000 on direct and third party rolls, its cofounder Gaurav Dubhashi said.

"We have added the workforce talent to enhance manufacturing capacity for 90-litre technical rucksacks designed and developed for defence establishments, reusable PPE overalls and hazmat suits, and reusable supermask respirators," Dubhashi told ET.

founder of executive search firm TeamLease Services, said: "We are seeing escalation in hiring of sectors such as education, healthcare and pharma, e-grocers and delivery apps, security management, fintech and cyber security. The hiring is happening in reaction to demand and not pre-empting demand." Food companies are hiring to meet rapidly increasing in-home demand as malls and restaurants remain shut in several cities and people largely avoiding eating out.

"This would be a highly automated plant in Talegaon with advanced robotics technology integrated in many of the production processes," Shil said. GWM had acquired the plant at Talegaon near Pune from General Motors earlier this year for a consideration of about ₹1,000 crore.

ED Files Plea, Wants Jet Probe to Continue

Mumbai: The Enforcement Directorate (ED) on Tuesday filed an intervention plea before a local court here, requesting the judge to continue an ongoing probe against Jet Airways and Naresh Goyal after the city police closed a complaint that had claimed forgery and cheating by the grounded carrier and its founder. The application comes after the Mumbai Police filed a closure report in the cheating and forgery case registered against the mothballed airline, saying that there was no evidence case against Jet Airways or its founder.

Sources said that the ED move was prompted as its money laundering case against Goyal and others is based on the predicate offence of cheating and forgery lodged by the Mumbai Police. "A probe under the Prevention of Money Laundering Act (PMLA) is based on a predicate offence registered by another

law enforcement agency. In this case, the ED's Enforcement Case Information Report (ECIR) was based on Mumbai Police's case. Since the police closed the case, it will have an adverse effect on the money laundering probe and hence an intervention application has been filed," said a source privy to the details.

Other than the ED, the complainant, Akbar Travels India also plans to file a protest petition on July 6 when the matter will be heard next. "There is enough evidence to show that our client was induced to infuse more money by bringing in business in Jet Airways on personal assurances by the director," said Advocate Dharmesh Joshi, appearing on behalf of Akbar Travels. "There is a strong case of money laundering and the same should be probed thoroughly."

'Low-cost Steroid may Help Cut Covid Deaths'

Mumbai: A steroid drug costing less than ₹200 has been shown to reduce deaths among severe Covid-19 patients, bringing hope of a cure for the disease.

Chief investigators of the Recovery Trial in the UK found that the steroid dexamethasone reduces deaths by one-third in patients hospitalised with severe respiratory complications of Covid-19.

The Recovery Trial was established to test existing drugs to treat Covid-19, including low-dose dexamethasone. Over 11,500 patients were enrolled for the trial from over 175 National Health System hospitals in the UK.

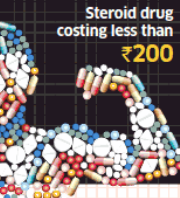
These investigators had found

that hydroxychloroquine was ineffective for Covid-19. The other treatments being tested in the Recovery Trial for Covid-19 are Lopinavir-Ritonavir, Tocilizumab, Azithromycin and convalescent plasma.

The investigators found in their randomised control trial that one death could be prevented for every eight patients on ventilators and for every 25 patients requiring oxygen. "This is an extremely welcome result. The survival benefit is clear and large in those patients who are sick enough to require oxygen treatment, so dexamethasone should now become standard of care in these patients," Peter Horby, one of the chief investigators of the Recovery Trial, said in a statement on Tuesday.

India's health ministry last week recommended that a similar class of drug called methylprednisolone be used to treat moderately ill Covid-19 patients. The dosage recommended by the health ministry is

0.5 to 1 mg/kg for three days, preferably within 48 hours of admission or if oxygen requirement increases and if inflammatory markers are increased. The Recovery Trial randomly selected 2,014 patients to receive 6 mg of dexamethasone on-

ce a day either orally or by injection for 10 days. These patients were compared with 4,321 patients randomised to usual care alone. Among the patients who received usual care alone, 28-day mortality was highest in those who required ventilation (41%), intermediate in those patients who required oxygen only (25%), and lowest among those who did not require any respiratory intervention (13%).

Dexamethasone reduced deaths by one-third in ventilated patients and by one-fifth in other patients receiving oxygen, the researchers said. There was no benefit found in patients who did not require respiratory support.

Steroids were also used in treating patients of South Asian Respiratory Syndrome and Middle Eastern Respiratory Syndrome.

'India to Allow HCQ Treatment in Mild Cases'

New Delhi: Indian health authorities have said that Hydroxychloroquine (HCQ) would not be withdrawn as a treatment methodology for Covid-19 patients, arguing that the decision to use it was scientific, even as the US Food and Drug Administration on Monday withdrew emergency use of the prophylactic.

HCQ, currently used to treat lupus and rheumatoid arthritis, has split world opinion on its use in Covid-19 management, even as India said the decision was "taken based on risk-benefit assessment".

"We have just changed the clinical management guidelines last week. We are not considering any changes just because the US FDA has withdrawn the emergency use for HCQ," a senior official in the drug controller's office said.

The health ministry, experts from the Indian Council of Medical Research and the Drug Controller General of India reviewed the clinical management protocol for Covid-19 on June 13 and limited HCQ's use to management of moderate patients, advising that it be avoided in patients with "severe disease".

"The review was felt necessary because of growing evidence on the drug... I don't think there is any alarming evi-

den- ce that has come forward that we need to follow suit," another official added.

Meanwhile, a debate is raging among public health specialists in India over the use of repurposed HCQ for Covid-19 treatment.

The ICMR task force has also been divided over the use of the drug. While many experts expressed their dissent over its continued use, the ICMR decided to go ahead as most experts were of the view that it did not cause severe problems.

"The moot question is, how long can a drug be allowed to be used for medication in the absence of any beneficial effect notwithstanding absence of harm," asked a public health expert on condition of anonymity.

Public health experts are of the view that the government is not following guidelines for Monitored Emergency Use of Unregistered and Investigational Interventions, an ethical protocol developed to evaluate the potential use of experimental drugs during public health emergencies.

According to some microbiologists, "its use could unnecessarily expose patients to health risks. Hence, the guideline to use HCQ may be withdrawn."

'Delivered at Doorstep, Alcohol to Flow more Smoothly'

Mumbai: United Spirits, India's biggest liquor company with a brand portfolio that includes Johnny Walker and McDowell, said home delivery and online sales will not just expand the basket size but also help more women consumers.

"In many states, women do not want to go into a retail store to buy alcohol - it's just unpleasant. In fact, I would go to the extent of saying they feel unsafe. If you are ordering online, you will browse and you will buy what you want," Anand Kripalu, managing director at the Diageo-controlled company, told investors during an earnings call.

For the spirits industry, accessibility is one of the biggest barriers for consumption in a market with 75,000 retail outlets, compared with over 10 million stores for fast moving consumer products. Also, after the lockdown, several stores have restricted the entry of people by placing counters in front, which could alter the display of products.

"When you start browsing in a retail store, you end up buying more than you did in an over-the-counter store. The day you start browsing on Amazon or Flipkart, you start buying a lot more things than you did and you are able to double click and get a lot more details," Kripalu added. Many state governments that lost revenue during the lockdown tried to boost their coffers with a tax increase after the Centre allowed liquor shops to open in the first week of May. At present, two-thirds of the retail outlets have reopened and initially saw massive queues outside outlets. Yet, sales volumes plummeted by 33% to 90% last month in five markets that account

for 40% of the country's spirits segment due to the high taxes on liquor.

Almost a dozen states including Maharashtra, West Bengal, Delhi, Punjab and Tamil Nadu have allowed home delivery of liquor, something companies have been trying to unlock for many years. Also, Zomato and Swiggy now deliver alcohol in some states. "Online can help companies plan activities around product development as new audience and channels can provide additional insights on changing consumption behaviour," said Devendra Chawla, managing director of Spencer's Retail and Nature's Basket.
